The Academic Team has completed another great season. Here are just a few of the highlights from 2005-2006, when we:

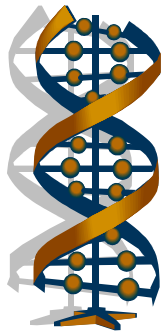
- Won the University of Maryland's High School Invitational Tournament,

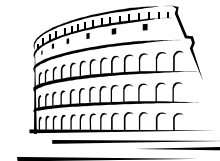

CHESS TEAM

TJ's Chess Team continued to astound in 2005-2006. In November, the team finished third at the National Youth Action Tournament in Atlanta, taking home 17 trophies and 5 plaques. They followed this achievement by winning the Southern Division of the Metro Area Chess League (MACL) and then winning the 2006 title for the Virginia Scholastic Chess Championships. This was their 8th consecutive state title, and it was also the 5th consecutive year that a TJ student -- freshman Eddie Lu -- was the individual in first place. Atul Kannan took home a trophy for 8th place.



The Chess Team then capped off the year by taking fifth place in the National High School Championship in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Over 1400 players from hundreds of schools across the country competed in this event. Competing for TJ were Eddie Lu, Byron Hood, Tim Chen, Atul Kannan, Yang He, Jacob Steinhardt, Tom Chen, Emma Pierson, Brian Hu, Alissa Perman and Nick Loffredo. This is a tremendous accomplishment during a "rebuilding year" for our very young team (of only 3 juniors, 6 sophomores, and 2 freshman).

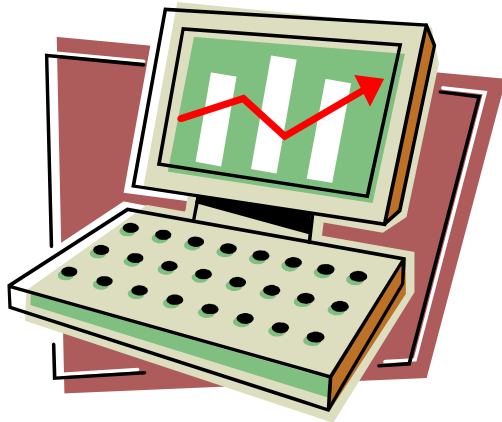

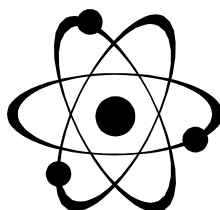
ODYSSEY OF THE MIND

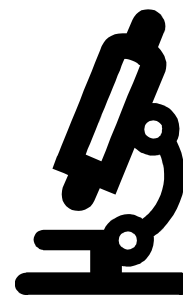

SCIENCE BOWL

The Team competed and won the Virginia Regionals and then went on to compete in a field of 65 teams to win the U.S. Department of Energy National Science Bowl. There they placed 1st in the Interactive Science Activity. In the Science Bowl contest, they went 9-0 before losing to the champion team, State College HS. This placed them 5th out of 65 regional teams and earned \$1,000 for TJ.
